SECOND COLLECTION

There is a special second collection this weekend to benefit the victims of drought & famine. More than 12 million people in East Africa are in need of food aid because of the severe drought. The U.N. says 2.8 million of those are in need of immediate lifesaving assistance, including more than 450,000 in Somalia's famine zones. The United States estimates that more than 29,000 Somali children under age 5 have died in the famine in the last three months. An unknown number too weak to walk farther have been abandoned on the sandy trek to help after food and water supplies ran out. All monies collected will be sent to a Catholic Agency on the ground in the devastated parts of Africa.

Music and the Liturgy: Mass Parts and the New Roman Missal

Last week's column dealt with the use of music in the liturgy. I did so to provide background information for this week's column, which addresses the issue of why we will be using new musical settings when the changes go into effect on November 27th.

We need new musical settings because the translation of the New Roman Missal poses significant problems for musicians and composers. The nature and extent of these problems are, perhaps, best illustrated if we compare the current and new refrain texts for the *Gloria*. Currently, here's what we say or sing:

Glory to God in the highest; and peace to his people on earth.

The new text is:

Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace to people of good will.

Notice two things about these texts. First, the current text has sixteen syllables; the new text has eighteen. More importantly, if you read each line out loud, you can hear how differently they sound. This is because the accented syllables, rhythm, and pattern for each line is different (the accented syllables are in **bold**).

When we try to set the new texts to the old music . . . well, it's like trying to put new wine into old wineskins. The new text doesn't quite fit the old melodies; it sounds awkward and forced.

Of the six major mass parts, the *Gloria* poses the greatest problem. The texts for the *Alleluia*, *Great Amen* and *Lamb of God* have not changed, and there are relatively minor changes in the *Holy, Holy* and the *Acclamation of Faith*.

Right now, the conversation among liturgists and pastoral musicians is whether we should a) "force" the revised texts into already-familiar melodies or b) learn new melodies that are specifically written to accommodate the revised texts. The problem with using the familiar melodies is that many of us will, out of habit, lapse back into singing the old texts. The problem with new melodies is the problem we always have with new music: it takes a while to learn.

At St. Teresa's, this is what we will probably do. In the fall, we will introduce new musical settings for the Mass parts whose texts have not changed (*Alleluia*, *Amen*, *Lamb of God*). Then, when we have to implement the new texts on November 27th, we will have already become familiar with the new melodies for the Mass parts. This should make the introduction of the new, revised texts as seamless as possible.
