## The New Roman Missal, Music and the Liturgy: An Update

The United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has made an allowance for each diocesan bishop to give permission for the gradual introduction of musical settings of the people's parts of the Mass from the new edition of the *Roman Missal*. In the Archdiocese of San Francisco, Archbishop Niederauer has granted the following permissions.

- New musical settings for the "Kyrie eleison/Lord, have mercy," "Alleluia", "Great Amen", and "Lamb of God" may be introduced at any time as there is no difference between these texts in the current *Sacramentary* and in the new *Roman Missal*.
- Beginning the evening of Saturday, October 29<sup>th</sup>, 2011, musical settings of the new translation of the *Sanctus* (Holy, Holy, Holy) and the *Mysterium fidei* (Mystery of faith, or memorial acclamation) may be sung.
- Beginning on the evening of Saturday, October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2011, musical settings of the new translation of the *Gloria* (Glory to God in the highest) may be used.

At the present time, we are trying to find a suitable, musical setting for the new Mass parts to be used at St. Teresa's. This is not as easy as it sounds. As soon as the implementation of the new *Roman Missal* was made official, composers and publishers have been churning out dozens of new mass settings in anticipation of November 27<sup>th</sup>. Unfortunately, the new musical settings are not particularly exciting. The consensus among liturgists and musicians that I've talked to is that nothing has yet emerged which would become "standard repertoire" in the North American Parish (like Marty Haugen's *Mass of Creation*, for example). Our interim hope is that we will be able to find something that is simple and singable, if only to allow us to learn and become comfortable with the new translations. Once this is accomplished, we can then move to musical settings that are more challenging and exciting.
