THE ARCHBISHOP'S ANNUAL APPEAL

The purpose of the Archbishop's Annual Appeal (AAA) is to assist in funding the overall budget of the Archdiocese of San Francisco. The AAA helps to fund over forty ministries, programs, and services that benefit not only parishes within the Archdiocese but also people who are unaffiliated with any parish or even with the Church. Some of these include the Offices of Religious Education, Worship, and Youth Ministries, as well as the Marriage Tribunal and Archdiocesan newspaper, the *Catholic San Francisco*.

In 2013, the budget for the Archdiocese of San Francisco is approximately \$9.63 million dollars. Through parish assessments, the Archbishop's Annual Appeal contributes roughly \$5.47 million towards this amount. Each of the 95 parishes or mission churches in the Archdiocese is assessed a particular amount, and this year's average assessment is \$57,565. St. Teresa's is one of the smaller parishes in the Archdiocese, and our assessment is \$20,300.

The 2013 AAA theme is, "For wherever your treasure is, that is where your heart will be too". (Luke 12:34) The Archbishop's Annual Appeal provides funding that furthers the mission of Jesus in this archdiocese, enabling us to do things that no single parish can accomplish alone.

It is important to note that although the AAA is promoted as an annual fund raising drive, it is, in reality, a tax or assessment on each parish. This means that what is not raised through pledges and contributions must be taken from the parish reserves or operating account.

Until recently, St. Teresa's did not formally undertake the Archbishop's Annual Appeal, electing instead to pay the entire assessment out of our reserves. It was only in 2009 that Fr. Paul Warren reinstated the AAA, and in two of the past four years – including last year – we have realized our assessment.

All AAA contributions are tax deductible and **are eligible for matching funds if your business or employer has such a program**. Monies contributed to AAA are used for funding the ministries and services of the Archdiocese; they are not used for legal fees or settlement costs incurred by lawsuits. In addition, any monies raised above our assessment are returned to St. Teresa's parish.

The appeal runs for the duration of the calendar year, January 1st through December 31st. Last year we raised our entire assessment by late spring, and this year we would like to accomplish this even earlier. This weekend we are making available preliminary information about the AAA, and next weekend (February 9th & 10th) Fr. Greenwell will preach about the AAA at all the Masses. It is our hope that this will be the *only* time that we will preach about the AAA this year. Our goal is to quickly secure pledges that will fulfill our assessment of \$20,300.

On behalf of Fr. Greenwell, myself, and the Archdiocese of San Francisco, thank you in advance for your consideration and generosity.
