## JULY 16<sup>TH</sup>, OUR LADY OF MOUNT CARMEL, & THE BROWN SCAPULAR

July 16<sup>th</sup> is the feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. In the liturgical calendar of the universal church it is celebrated as a memorial. But within the Carmelite Order we celebrate it as a solemnity. Carmelites consider Mary to be the patroness of the Order, and our official name is the *Order of the Brothers of the Blessed Virgin Mary of Mount Carmel*.

Carmelites, perhaps, are best known for their association with the brown scapular, a devotional sacramental worn by many of the faithful. The scapular tradition dates from the mid 12<sup>th</sup> century when St. Simon Stock, an early prior general of the Carmelites, had a vision of the Blessed Virgin Mary (Our Lady of Mount Carmel) on July 16, 1251. Mary entrusted St. Simon Stock with the brown scapular, a gift which included the promise that those who died wearing the scapular would "never suffer everlasting fire." This promise, known as the *Sabbatine Privilege*, states that Mary herself would graciously descend on the Saturday after a person's death and liberate from purgatory those who died wearing the scapular. Although the historicity of this tradition has long been called into question, the religious practice of wearing the scapular has been a popular devotion for over 700 years.

There are actually two types of scapulars. The first is the scapular worn by religious men and women as part of their religious habit. Fr. Greenwell and I wear such a scapular. This "monastic scapular" appeared perhaps as early as the 7<sup>th</sup> century in the Order of Saint Benedict (Benedictines). It is a somewhat large length of cloth suspended both front and back from the shoulders, often reaching to the knees. This type of scapular looks like an apron, which was probably its original function.

The second type of scapular, the devotional scapular, typically consists of two small (usually rectangular) pieces of cloth. Less than two inches in size, these pieces of fabric may bear religious images or text. These are joined by two bands of cloth. The wearer places one square on the chest, rests the bands one on each shoulder, and lets the second square drop down the back.

In my province it has been our custom to make scapulars available to those we serve in our ministries. Thus, in our secondary schools and parishes, we provide scapulars for our students and parishioners. We have about 300 scapulars available for distribution after the masses this weekend, scapulars which were provided by the Carmelite Sisters of Cristo Rey.

This year July 16<sup>th</sup> falls on a Monday, and there will be a special 6:15pm parish Mass to celebrate the Solemnity. We will be using the *Carmelite Sacramentary* and *Carmelite Lectionary*, which have special prayers, propers, and readings for the feast. Please join us!
