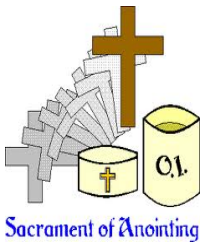


GARDEN FUND

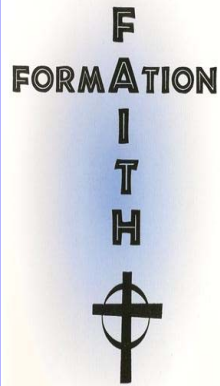

THE LITURGICAL CALENDAR AND ORDINARY TIME

For the past four weeks we've been wearing green vestments, and we'll be wearing the green until November 20th, the Feast of Christ the King. In the liturgical year we are in "Ordinary Time" . . . but what does that mean?

First of all, "ordinary time" is a bit of a misnomer, since there is nothing "ordinary" about the Eucharist or the Mass. What we call "ordinary time" is a translation of the Latin term *tempus per annum*, which means, literally, "time through the year". The Church distinguishes Ordinary Time from the special seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter, and perhaps the best way to understand "ordinary time" is to take a look at the seasons that make up the liturgical calendar.

The most important "time" of the liturgical year is the Lent-Easter season. Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and continues until Easter Sunday, with the Easter Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday) serving as a bridge between Lent and Easter. The Easter Season consists of the 50 days from Easter through Pentecost. When coupled with the 40 days of Lent, this Lent-Easter season contains 90 days, or about one-fourth of the liturgical year.

The two other major seasons of the liturgical year surround the celebration of the Lord's birth. Prior to Christmas there are four Sundays of Advent. The transition to the Christmas Season takes place on Christmas Eve, and the Christmas Season continues through the first two Sundays of the new year. In most years these Sundays celebrate the Epiphany and the Baptism of the Lord. The Baptism of the Lord brings to a close the Christmas Season while simultaneously serving as the First Sunday in Ordinary Time.

Of the 52 Sundays in the year, 13 are contained in the Lent-Easter season and 6 or 7 make up the Advent-Christmas cycle. Depending on the day of the week for Christmas and the date of Ash Wednesday, there are either 33 or 34 Sundays in Ordinary Time.

In the liturgical year, our first experience of Ordinary Time is the period between the Baptism of the Lord and Ash Wednesday. After the Lent/Easter Season, Ordinary Time resumes on the Monday after Pentecost and continues until the First Sunday of Advent. Technically speaking, we have been in Ordinary Time since May 16th, but the green vestments didn't appear until June 5th because, on the two Sundays following Pentecost, white vestments were worn on Trinity Sunday and *Corpus Christi*.

When a major feast falls on a Sunday it takes precedence over the "Sunday in Ordinary Time." This always happens on the First Sunday of Ordinary Time (the Baptism of the Lord), as well as on Trinity Sunday and *Corpus Christi*. But there are other times when this can happen. When the Presentation of the Lord (February 2nd), the Transfiguration (August 6th), the Triumph of the Cross (September 14th), All Saints' Day (November 1st), or the Feast of St. John Lateran (November 9th) falls on a Sunday, the feast is celebrated instead of the Sunday in Ordinary Time.

In the Liturgical year, the Last Sunday in Ordinary Time is Solemnity of Christ the King which, this year, is on November 20th. White Vestments will be worn on that day, and on the following Sunday, November 27th, we celebrate the First Sunday of Advent and the beginning of a new liturgical year.
