## PREPARING FOR EASTER, PART TWO

In last week's column I wrote about the catechumenate. I mentioned that we already have one adult and several children who, hopefully, will receive the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist next Easter. When I wrote last week's column, I did so in an attempt to surface additional participants for the catechumenate. This week, I repeat my request: If you know of a family member, friend, or acquaintance who might want to become a Catholic, please have that person contact the parish as soon as possible so that we might begin the process.

My purpose today is again to surface participants; this time, however, I am not looking for catechumens or candidates. Instead, I am looking for members of the parish community who would like to "walk the journey" with our catechumens and candidates, actively participating in their formation process. There are a number of ways that you can do this:

- *Become a member of the catechumenate team:* This involves attending meetings with the catechumens and candidates, participating in their reflection and discussion, answering their questions, and sharing your faith and experience with those planning to enter the Church.
- *Becoming a godparent or sponsor:* It is not unusual that a candidate or catechumen will ask a member of the parish community or catechumenate team to become his or her godparent or sponsor.
- *Becoming a catechist:* This involves a more active role in the catechumenate process. It would require additional preparation and training, as well as assuming a leadership role in the catechumenate sessions.

I am confident there are members of the parish community who, in the past, have been involved with the catechumenate, either at St. Teresa's or at another parish. If you have done this in the past, please consider sharing your time and treasure once again.

Because we will have children who will be fully initiated next Easter, I hope we will have some younger members of the parish community come forward to help in their formation. It is important that our children preparing for Initiation have someone "near their age" to walk with them on their journey, and I hope some of our high school and college students will be able to contribute in this capacity. To be a godparent or sponsor you must have completed your Christian Initiation (i.e., you must be confirmed), but those young people who have not yet received the Sacrament of Confirmation may still be involved in the catechumenate process and be part of the catechumenate team.

Diocesan Policy requires that those involved in the catechetical formation undergo Safe Environment Training, which we would like to accomplish before we begin the formal catechumenate. For this reason, we are asking for people to come forward now, in the summer, so that we may complete our preparation and be ready to begin the catechumenate this fall.
