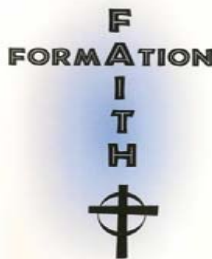

The **RCIA** (Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults) is the process where new members are incorporated into the Church. The preparation takes nearly a year, beginning in the Fall and cumulating at the Easter Vigil with the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist.

## THE LITURGICAL YEAR: ORDINARY TIME

The green vestments are back! With two exceptions, green vestments will be worn from now until the end of November . . . which means that we are in "Ordinary Time". But what does that mean?

First of all, "Ordinary Time" is a bit of a misnomer, since there is nothing "ordinary" about the Eucharist or the Mass. What we call "Ordinary Time" is a translation of the Latin term *tempus per annum*, which means – literally – "time through the year". The Church distinguishes "time throughout the year" from the special seasons of Advent, Christmas, Lent, and Easter, and perhaps the best way to understand "Ordinary Time" is to examine the seasons that make up the liturgical calendar.

The most important "time" of the liturgical year is the Lent-Easter season. Lent begins on Ash Wednesday and continues until Easter Sunday, with the Easter Triduum (Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday) serving as a bridge between the Lent and the Easter Seasons. Easter Season runs from Easter Sunday through Pentecost Sunday – a total of 50 days – and, when coupled with the 40-days of Lent, this Lent-Easter season contains 90 days, or about one-fourth of the liturgical year.

The other major seasons of the liturgical year surround the celebration of the Lord's birth at Christmas. Prior to Christmas there are four Sundays of Advent, and the Christmas season continues through the first two Sundays following the New Year. In the United States, these two Sundays celebrate the Epiphany and the Baptism of the Lord, with the Baptism of the Lord bringing to a close the Christmas Season while also serving as the First Sunday in Ordinary Time.

Of the 52 Sundays in the year, 13 are contained in the Lent-Easter season and 6 or 7 make up the Advent-Christmas cycle. Depending on the day of the week for Christmas and the date of Ash Wednesday, there are either 33 or 34 Sundays in Ordinary Time.

In the liturgical year, our first experience of Ordinary Time is the period between the Baptism of the Lord and Ash Wednesday. After the Lent/Easter Season, Ordinary Time resumes on the Monday after Pentecost and continues until the First Sunday of Advent. Technically speaking, we have been in Ordinary Time since May 25<sup>th</sup>, but the green vestments haven't appeared until today because, on the two Sundays following Pentecost, white vestments are worn on Trinity Sunday and *Corpus Christi*.

When a major feast falls on a Sunday it takes precedence over the "Sunday in Ordinary Time." This happens every year on Trinity Sunday and *Corpus Christi*, but it also occurs when feasts such as the Triumph of the Cross (September 14<sup>th</sup> – red vestments) or the Feast of St. John Lateran (November 9<sup>th</sup> – white vestments) fall on a Sunday. This year, All Saints' Day (November 1<sup>st</sup>) falls on a Sunday, so white vestments will be worn that day to celebrate the solemnity.

The Solemnity of Christ the King is always celebrated on the Last Sunday in Ordinary Time which, this year, is on November 22<sup>nd</sup>. White Vestments will be worn on that day, and the following Sunday, November 29<sup>th</sup>, is the First Sunday of Advent and the beginning of a new liturgical year.
