#### IT'S THAT TIME OF YEAR AGAIN . . .

This weekend marks the kick-off for the Archdiocesan Annual Appeal (AAA), and in this week's column I'd like to provide some background material and supplemental information about this annual campaign.

The purpose of the Archdiocesan Annual Appeal is to assist in funding the overall budget of the Archdiocese of San Francisco. The AAA helps to fund over forty ministries, programs. and services that benefit not only parishes within the Archdiocese but also people who are unaffiliated with any parish or even with the Church. Some of these include the Offices of Religious Education, Worship, and Youth Ministries, as well as the Diocesan Marriage Tribunal and the Archdiocesan newspaper, the Catholic San Francisco.

This year, the Archdiocese hopes to raise approximately \$6.4 million dollars. Here are a few things to consider:

- The Archdiocese of San Francisco has 93 parishes spread over three counties (San Francisco, Marin, and San Mateo), and the average assessment is \$68,796.
- In San Francisco County there are 44 parishes and the average assessment is \$57.185.
- This year, the assessment for St. Teresa's is \$26,520, an increase of \$4,320 (19.5%) over last year's assessment (\$22,200).
- Compared to other parishes in San Francisco County, 35 have an assessment higher than St. Teresa's, and 8 have an assessment lower than St. Teresa's.
- On the diocesan level, 78 parishes have an assessment higher than St. Teresa's while 14 parishes have an assessment that is *lower* than St. Teresa's.
- In San Francisco County, the highest assessment is \$219,286 (St. Ignatius), whereas the lowest assessment is \$4,169 (Our Lady of Guadalupe).
- The word assessment is actually a misnomer because it's not so much an assessment as it is a tax. What does this mean? It means that if we don't raise \$26,520 through pledges, the balance is "billed" to the parish and comes out of our operating account.
- Once we reach our assessed goal, we stop preaching about AAA until next year. In other words, once we secure \$26.520 in pledges you will not hear about AAA until 2017.
- Once we make our pledge, any additional monies received are returned to the parish. In the past, we have deposited those monies in a special account, such as for the windows or garden fund.
- All AAA contributions are tax deductible to the full extent provided by the law, and are eligible for matching funds if your business or employer has such a program.
- Monies contributed to AAA are used for funding the ministries and services of the Archdiocese; they are not used for legal fees or settlement costs incurred by lawsuits.
- You can spread your pledge over ten months (March through December) using a credit card or the automatic debit feature (ACH) from your bank account (use the link, below), or you can make a one-time aift using the form provided in the brochure.

In past years we have raised enough money to fulfill our assessed obligation. Fr. Greenwell and I deeply appreciate the generosity of our parishioners in reaching our goal. Thank you in advance for your generosity and your contribution the Archdiocesan Annual Appeal.
