THE PALM SUNDAY "LISTENING SESSION" WITH YOUNG ADULTS, PART II

On Palm Sunday, Angela Pollock from the Archdiocesan Office of Young Adult & Campus Ministry met with a group of St. Teresa's young adults for a "listening session" after the 10 o'clock Mass. The purpose of this meeting was to surface issues and concerns of the young adults in our parish in order that we might better address them in our ministry and outreach. This is the second of two columns "reporting back" to the parish highlights of this meeting.

I ended last week's column with a teaser question, "What is the one thing that, if you saw it offered in the bulletin, you would make sure to attend?" Surprisingly, the top answer of our young adults involved "service" . . . but not the kind you'd expect.

When both Fr. Greenwell and I heard the word "service" we immediately thought of things such as *Habitat for Humanity*. That's not what our young people meant. They were thinking along the lines of service *locally* – such as helping a needy parishioner – and wanted to be of service by doing things in both the local parish and the Potrero Hill community.

The second-place response went something like this: a support group for those dating in the Bay Area. When Angela pushed the question, members of the group clarified that this involved two things: support for singles living in the Bay Area, as well as opportunities to meet other singles.

As an aside, I'm not surprised with this response. In talking with young adults during my five years at the parish, I've been amazed at how many of them are "transplants" from somewhere else. They have relocated in the Bay Area because of jobs and other opportunities, but at the price of being separated from family and friends. I suspect that, at times, being single in the Bay Area must be an isolated, solitary, and lonely existence, and the challenge for us – as a parish community – is how to respond to this pressing and immediate concern in an appropriate and meaningful manner.

Not surprisingly, other issues surfaced by our young adults revolved around community: getting together to do "trivia" at a local bar; simple social gatherings; having, perhaps, a guest speaker; or having a retreat, for singles, couples, or both. Other suggestions that came out of the meeting included incorporating young adults in ministerial roles (lectors, hospitality ministers, etc.), as well as perhaps having a lay person do the announcements.

In the near future, I hope to meet again with our young adults to address a simple question, "Where do we go from here?" I'd like to structure the meeting as a brainstorming session, and, when we're finished, it would be great to have some "plans" for the next few months. Fr. Greenwell and I have some ideas and suggestions to include in the "brainstorm", but it is by far more important that any course of action be determined by the young adult members of our parish.

Next weekend (May 23-24) is Memorial Day Weekend, so perhaps a good time to meet again would be on either June 3rd or June 10th. This week I'll send out an e-mail to our young adults to see which would be the better date. If you're a young adult (and the Archdiocese considers anyone under 40 a young adult), e-mail me at mkwiecien@carmelnet.org and I'll add you to our (growing) e-mail list.
