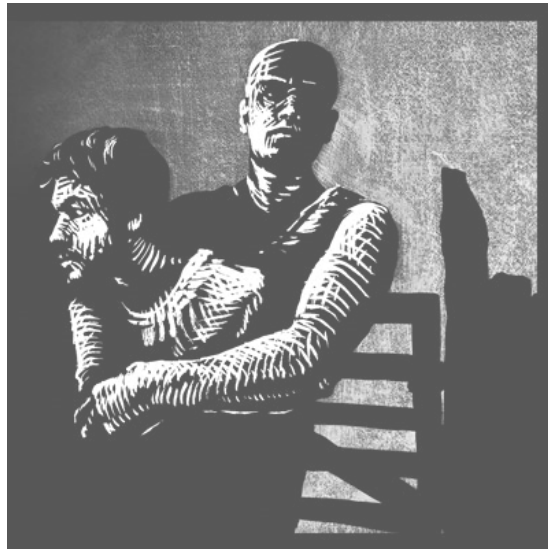

CONGREGATIONAL RESPONSES FOR MASS

Over the past year many of these weekly columns have addressed issues related to the Third Edition of the Roman Missal, the revised English translation of the Mass which is scheduled to be implemented on the First Sunday of Advent. The bishops have given parishes permission to gradually introduce these changes and have suggested that we begin on the first Sunday in October.

In your pews you will find new **Congregational Responses for Mass** cards. We've purchased these for the parish in order to facilitate a smooth transition to the new translation. These cards contain the responses and parts for the assembly. Before or after Mass you may want to read through the text in order to become familiar with some of the new language that will become official in less than two months. Notice that all of the changes from the current translation appear in **bold type**.

The bishops suggest that new musical settings of the *Gloria* be introduced on the first Sunday of October. The reason? During Advent the *Gloria* is not said or sung (except for December 8th, the Immaculate Conception). When the new translation goes into effect, the first time that the *Gloria* will be used will be at Christmas, and the consensus among bishops, liturgists, and musicians was that the introduction of a new *Gloria* on Christmas day would be a nightmare. Hence, permission has been given to introduce the new *Gloria* before the first Sunday of Advent.

The *Gloria*, when used, is supposed to be sung, but here at St. Teresa's we are going to *speak* the Gloria – at least through the month of October. We're doing this in order help the assembly become familiar with the words of the new text. Only after we become comfortable with the new translation will we introduce any new musical setting.

Also on this Sunday we would like to begin using *Penitential Act B*. As both a presider and member of the assembly, it has been my experience that this option is rarely (if ever) used. This is unfortunate, as the language is especially dignified and elegant.

In the months of October and November we hope to gradually introduce elements of the new liturgy. Tentatively, we have decided to use the revised musical setting of Bob Hurd's *Mass of Glory*. The parish is already familiar with this setting, and it is our hope that utilizing familiar music will be one less obstacle to the introduction of the new texts.
