St. Teresa's Stained Glass Windows

As you have noticed, we are in the process of painting the exterior of the church. We are doing this as part of the routine maintenance of the facilities, as it has been thirteen years since the building was last painted. In the process of securing estimates, we discovered that there was considerable rusting in the bell tower. Fortunately, we were able to attend to the rust issue before any major damage took place.

We have also made enquiries regarding the condition of our stained glass windows. St. Teresa's has a total of seventeen stained glass windows: twelve in the main body of the church, three in the vestibule, and two half-windows near the front (to the right and left of what used to be the side altars).

In the 1930s the church suffered a major fire and the twelve windows in the main body of the church were installed sometime after the fire. In fact, we believe that the three windows in the vestibule were originally in the main body of the church and were moved to the vestibule only after the fire.

Unfortunately, all of the windows are in need of restoration. In particular there are five windows in need of immediate repair: the three windows in the vestibule, the half-window of the young Christ, and the window of Christ gathering with the little children. In the process of securing bids and estimates several questions have emerged.

- Who are the saints in the windows facing 19th Street? Initially we thought that the woman was Teresa of Avila, but the religious habit is the wrong color for a Carmelite. We also assumed that the man was St. John of the Cross, but it has been suggested that the figure is St. Gerard Majella.
- What company or companies did the stained glass, and when were the windows installed?
- Who are the donors that are named in the windows?

We're asking you, our parishioners, to help us assemble a history of the windows. You can help us in three ways. First, we are looking for early photographs of the church that show the windows. Secondly, if you were born and raised on Potrero Hill (and I think that some of our parishioners were here in the roaring twenties) you might be able to provide some oral history about the windows. Finally, we would appreciate any information about the donors (or their families) who are named on the windows. We'd like to track them down to see whether their family history can shed some light on our parish history regarding the windows.
